# WHO IS NORTH CAROLINA HUMANITIES?

North Carolina Humanities (NC Humanities/NCH) has been a leading humanities funder in North Carolina since our founding in 1972. NC Humanities creates, facilitates and funds public humanities programs that help North Carolinians make sense of themselves, their neighbors, and their communities by considering new perspectives and thinking critically about the past, the present, and the future. North Carolina Humanities is the state affiliate of the National Endowment for the Humanities (NEH).

## OUR MISSION

To connect North Carolinians with cultural experiences that spur dialogue, deepen human connections, and inspire community.

A North Carolina enriched by the humanities and equipped with empathy, understanding, and respect.

## OUR VALUES

## ABOUT:

This summer fellowship opportunity supports continuous full or part-time work on a humanities project for a period of two consecutive months. Funds support recipients' compensation related to the proposed scholarly research.



- ▲ **Length of Fellowship:** 2 consecutive months, June-July
- ▲ **Funding Amount:** \$4,000 per month or part-time equivalent.
- ▲ **Time Commitment:** The fellowships supports individuals who work between half time and full-time on their projects. You may combine part- and full-time work, but you must work at least half time and the period of performance must be continuous. If you work full-time on your project, you must forgo teaching and other major activities. If you combine a part-time award with teaching, you must carry a reduced class load during the period of performance. Awards will be reduced to reflect the smaller time commitment when you work part time.
- ▲ **Expected Outputs of the Fellowship Include:** Archaeological Report; Article; Book; Digital Resource or Publication; Edition; Other Scholarly Resource; Translation; etc. NC Humanities will ask for samples of your outputs.

# ELIGIBILITY REQUIREMENTS

## ▲ Applicants must be eighteen years or older, reside in North Carolina, and be a U.S. citizen.

- Foreign nationals who have lived in the United States or its jurisdictions for at least the three years prior to the application deadline are also eligible. Foreign nationals who take up permanent residence outside the United States any time between the application deadline and the end of the period of performance will forfeit their eligibility. Leaving the U.S. on a temporary basis is permitted.

## ▲ Applicants must be affiliated with an institute of Higher Ed.

- Individual full-time, part-time, adjunct, and retired faculty members and staff members affiliated with an accredited institute of higher education in North Carolina including community colleges, colleges, and universities at the time of application are eligible to apply.

## ▲ You may only submit one application per year.

- If you have previously received a fellowship, you may apply to support a new project or a new stage of a previously supported project. NC Humanities will assess your application using the same criteria as others in the current competition. However, for previously supported projects, we will ask reviewers to consider the accomplishments from the prior award and determine if the project warrants additional support.



# FAQs

---

## ▲ Is there a residential option?

- This is a non-residential fellowship, designed to provide more flexibility and consideration for recipients.

## ▲ If selected, how will I receive my stipend?

- Upon acceptance, fellows will fill out a form and may elect to be paid through their institution or be paid directly.
- You must work full-time/part-time on your project as approved and may hold other non-NCH sources of support (for example, sabbaticals and supplementary funding) or grants for the same project during your period of performance.

## ▲ When can I take my two months?

- Fellowships support work carried out during the summer months June-July, but, occasionally, you may arrange for a period of performance at other times of the year. If you have questions, contact Caitlin Patton Stanley at [cpatton@nchumanities.org](mailto:cpatton@nchumanities.org).

## ▲ Is cost sharing required?

- No, cost sharing is not required in this program.

## ▲ Can fellowships be shared?

- The program is designed primarily for individual researchers; awards may not be divided.
- If you are seeking funding for more than one participant in a collaborative project, each person seeking funding must submit a separate application, specifying the individual contribution. NC Humanities will ask reviewers to evaluate each application on its own merits. Each application should clearly explain how the work will be divided and the extent to which each collaborator's contribution depends on that of the other(s). Applicants who are seeking funding only for themselves but who are working as part of a collaborative team are also eligible. In this case, too, the application should clearly explain how the work will be divided and the extent to which each collaborator's contribution depends on that of the other(s).

## ▲ Can my institution apply?

- Organizations are not eligible to apply on behalf of individuals and NC Humanities will not transfer awards to the applicant's institution. If you elect to have the stipend paid through your institution, the institution must remit all funds to you and not take an institutional allowance or claim indirect costs.

**NC Humanities will not consider incomplete, nonresponsive, or ineligible applications for funding.**

# WHAT ARE THE HUMANITIES?

**There are many ways to interpret what “the humanities” means.**

- ▲ The humanities are a set of disciplines which help us understand what it means to be human by exploring:
  - Our Past: history & archaeology
  - Our Cultural Expressions: anthropology, literature, linguistics, languages, art history, theory, and criticism
  - Our Values: ethics, philosophy, comparative religion, law
- ▲ The humanities can also be seen as a range of activities that revolve around exploring culture, such as reading a book, listening to a story, recording your memories and thoughts, talking with people, and questioning the values and motivations of ourselves and others.

Formally, the definition of “the humanities” according to the National Foundation on the Arts and Humanities Act (1965) includes, but is not limited to, the study and interpretation of the following:

- Language, both modern and classical
- Linguistics
- Literature
- History
- Jurisprudence
- Philosophy
- Archaeology
- Comparative religion
- Ethics
- The history, criticism, and theory of the arts
- Social sciences which have humanistic content and/or employ humanistic methods





# SUBMISSION INSTRUCTIONS

- ▲ Submission Method: Submissions are made electronically through our online system. Incomplete and ineligible applications will not be reviewed.
  - Note: NC Humanities only accepts applications and in our standard formats. We cannot accept ad hoc requests.
